Meaning: Dispel: to drive away or eliminate (myths, doubts, or fears) by providing clarification or evidence.

1. The teacher aimed to dispel the myths surrounding the historical figure.
2. To dispel any doubts about the project, the team presented detailed evidence.
3. She tried to dispel his fears by reassuring him of her support.
4. The documentary sought to dispel common misconceptions about climate change.
5. His calm demeanor helped to dispel the tension in the room.
