1. The constant rain seemed to dispirit the entire team before the big game.
2. Her lack of enthusiasm began to dispirit those around her, dampening the mood.
3. Even in the face of adversity, he refused to let anything dispirit his resolve.
4. The news of the project's cancellation did little to dispirit the dedicated volunteers.
5. She found it difficult to remain optimistic when so many challenges threatened to dispirit her spirit.
