Meaning: To drow means to become submerged or to sink due to an excess of weight or water.

1. The boat began to drow under the weight of the heavy cargo.
2. As the rain poured down, the river started to drow over its banks.
3. He watched in horror as the old pier began to drow, sinking slowly into the water.
4. The sudden storm caused the small vessel to drow, leaving its crew scrambling for safety.
5. With every passing second, the stage was at risk of drowning under the performers' elaborate set pieces.
