

EMBARRASS

Meaning: To cause someone to feel self-conscious, awkward, or ashamed, often due to a mistake or socially uncomfortable situation.

1. He felt embarrassed when he forgot his lines during the school play.
2. It can be quite embarrassing to trip in front of a large crowd.
3. She tried to embarrass her brother by sharing his childhood photos at the party.
4. His awkward dance moves only served to embarrass him further.
5. I didn't mean to embarrass you; I was just trying to lighten the mood.
6. She felt embarrassed when she tripped and fell in front of her classmates.
7. It can be embarrassing to admit that you don't know the answer in a group discussion.
