

EMBREAD

Meaning: EMBREAD (verb): To infuse or enrich with a mixture, whether in cooking (such as incorporating flavors into dough) or in creating a sense of connection and unity among people.

1. The artisan decided to embread the dough with a mix of herbs and spices for extra flavor.
2. After the meeting, the team felt embread in a sense of accomplishment and camaraderie.
3. She watched with delight as the children began to embread their drawings with vibrant colors.
4. The chef recommended that we embread the fish with a light coating of breadcrumbs for a crispy texture.
5. In the workshop, participants were encouraged to embread their stories with personal anecdotes to make them relatable.
