

ENDICT

Meaning: Endict (verb): To formally accuse or charge someone with a crime, typically through a legal process.

1. The court had to endict the defendant after the overwhelming evidence was presented.
2. To endict someone requires a thorough investigation and careful consideration of the facts.
3. The grand jury voted to endict the official for corruption and abuse of power.
4. In a surprising turn of events, the prosecutor decided not to endict the suspect after new evidence emerged.
