

ERASEMENT

Meaning: Easement: a legal right to use another's land for a specific purpose, such as access or utility installation.

1. The developer's plans for the new mall included an easement agreement with the adjacent property owner.
2. To ensure access to the waterway, the city established an easement for public use along the riverbank.
3. The landowner was reluctant to grant an easement for the utility company, fearing future restrictions.
4. During the property dispute, the easement's terms became a central point of contention between neighbors.
