

EXEMPT

Meaning: Exempt means to be free from an obligation or requirement that others must fulfill.

1. Students with disabilities are often exempt from certain testing requirements.
2. The charity organization applied for a status that would exempt them from paying taxes.
3. Employees in this department are exempt from the usual overtime regulations.
4. Some goods are exempt from sales tax to encourage consumer spending.
5. The new policy will exempt low-income families from additional fees.
6. Students from low-income families are often exempt from paying tuition fees at many universities.
7. The new tax law will exempt small businesses from certain tax liabilities for the next five years.
8. Employees who work more than 40 hours a week might be exempt from overtime pay according to company policy.
9. Certain non-profit organizations are exempt from federal income tax under IRS guidelines.
10. Those with medical disabilities may be exempt from certain employment requirements to promote inclusivity.
11. Certain organizations are exempt from paying taxes under specific conditions.
12. Students with disabilities may be exempt from certain standardized testing requirements.
13. The new policy will exempt small businesses from certain regulatory compliance costs.
14. Due to her outstanding academic performance, she was exempt from the final exam.
15. Non-profit entities are often exempt from many fees that apply to for-profit companies.
