

EXPECTORATE

Meaning: Expectorate: to cough up and spit out phlegm or other material from the respiratory tract.

1. The doctor instructed the patient to expectorate into a tissue to monitor his cough.
2. During the examination, the nurse asked the child to expectorate so she could check for any mucus abnormalities.
3. To clear his throat, he had to expectorate forcefully after drinking the cold beverage.
