

FALLACY

Meaning: A fallacy is a mistaken belief or error in reasoning, often arising from flawed logic or assumptions.

1. A common fallacy in debates is the ad hominem attack, which targets the person rather than their argument.
2. Many people believe in the fallacy that correlation implies causation without understanding the nuances of statistical analysis.
3. The fallacy of composition occurs when one assumes that what is true for a part is also true for the whole.
4. In her essay, she pointed out the fallacy in his reasoning, demonstrating how it led to incorrect conclusions.
5. Challenging the fallacy of the "perfect storm," he explained how multiple factors can lead to a disaster, not just one.
