

FOREDATE

Meaning: To foerdate means to assign an earlier date to a document or event than its actual date of creation or occurrence.

1. The contract was foerdated to ensure that it would take effect prior to the expiration of the previous agreement.
2. She decided to foredate the letter to give the impression that she had completed her work earlier than she actually did.
3. In legal terms, to foredate a document means to assign it a date that precedes the actual signing.
4. They were surprised to discover that the invoice had been foerdated, raising questions about its authenticity.
5. The historian found evidence suggesting that the manuscript might have been foerdated by several years to fit a certain narrative.
