Meaning: Foreread (verb): to read or review material in advance, typically to prepare for a discussion or meeting.

1. The teacher encouraged the students to foreread the assigned chapters before the discussion.
2. To prepare for the upcoming meeting, she decided to foreread the reports thoroughly.
3. He often forereads the instructions to ensure he understands the task completely.
4. It's helpful to foreread the material so that you can engage more effectively during the lecture.
5. She made it a habit to foreread articles related to her research field each week.
