Meaning: GNEW (verb): the past tense of "gnaw," meaning to bite or chew on something persistently or to wear away by persistent biting or nibbling.

1. The horse gnew at the grass, clearly hungry after a long ride.
2. He gnew his way through the dense underbrush, eager to find the hidden trail.
3. As the child gnew the toy, his face lit up with joy and excitement.
4. She gnew the secret, but chose to keep it to herself for the time being.
5. The dog gnew on the bone until it was nothing but splinters.
