Meaning: A groundling is a spectator, particularly in a theater, who stands in the cheapest area, often at the pit, to watch a performance.

1. The groundling cheered enthusiastically from the cheap seats as the play unfolded.
2. In Shakespearean times, groundlings stood at the pit of the theater, enjoying performances for a low price.
3. The director aimed to engage the groundlings with a lively spectacle that would appeal to their tastes.
4. Many groundlings were known for their rowdy behavior, often shouting and interacting with the actors.
5. In modern adaptations, filmmakers sometimes pay homage to groundlings by including audience reactions in the storyline.
