

HELIACAL

Meaning: Heliacal refers to the rising or visibility of a celestial body, particularly a star or planet, just before sunrise or at dawn.

1. The heliacal rising of the star Sirius marked the beginning of the ancient Egyptian new year.
2. Astronomers noted the heliacal visibility of several planets during the summer solstice.
3. In many cultures, heliacal events were celebrated as significant markers of time and season.
4. The heliacal appearance of a constellation often coincided with important agricultural practices.
