

# HYPOBOLE

*Meaning: Hypobole refers to a rhetorical technique that involves understatement or the deliberate downplaying of a situation or idea, often used to create contrast with hyperbole.*

1. The speaker's use of hyperbole to emphasize his point left the audience both amused and skeptical.
2. In literature, hyperbole is often employed to create dramatic effects and engage readers' imaginations.
3. She said she was so hungry she could eat a horse, clearly a hyperbole meant to illustrate her extreme appetite.
4. His exaggerated claims about the car's speed were nothing more than hyperbole to attract potential buyers.
5. The comedian's routine was filled with hyperbole, making everyday situations seem outrageously funny.
