

IMBANK

Meaning: To imbank means to construct a bank or embankment along a waterway to control or direct its flow, often for flood prevention or irrigation purposes.

1. The engineer decided to imbank the river to prevent flooding in the nearby village.
2. Farmers often imbank their fields to manage water flow during the rainy season.
3. To enhance the landscape, the city planners chose to imbank the edges of the park's pond.
4. The environmental group advocated for natural methods instead of choosing to imbank the shorelines.
5. After heavy rains, the workers rushed to imbank the areas most prone to erosion.
