

IMPOUND

Meaning: To impound means to seize and hold property, typically by legal authority, such as vehicles or goods, due to violations or for evidence.

1. The city decided to impound the vehicles of those who parked illegally during the festival.
2. After the police found the stolen car, they had to impound it as evidence.
3. The animal control officer was forced to impound the stray dog for its safety and the community's.
4. If you fail to pay your fines, they may impound your belongings until the debt is settled.
5. The authorities will impound any boats that are operating without the necessary permits.
