

IMPROVISATE

Meaning: IMPROVISATE (verb): To create or perform spontaneously without preparation, often in response to unexpected circumstances.

1. He had to improvise when the original plan fell through.
2. The musician was able to improvise a beautiful melody on the spot.
3. During the workshop, participants were encouraged to improvise their scenes.
4. She could easily improvise a speech when faced with unexpected questions.
5. The chef decided to improvise with the ingredients he had in the pantry.
6. He had to improvisate a solution when the original plan fell through.
7. The actors were trained to improvisate their lines during the performance.
8. In the kitchen, she learned to improvisate meals with whatever ingredients were available.
9. During the meeting, he was forced to improvisate his presentation due to a technical glitch.
10. To keep the audience engaged, the comedian decided to improvisate based on their reactions.

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
