Meaning: Impugment refers to the act of calling into question or challenging the validity or integrity of someone or something, particularly in a legal or scholarly context.

3. His constant impugment of her abilities created a tense atmosphere in the workplace.
4. The committee rejected the impugment, stating that all evidence was thoroughly reviewed.
