

INBIND

Meaning: Inbind (verb): To bind or secure pages or materials together, often for preservation or durability.

1. The artist decided to inbind the torn pages of her sketchbook to preserve her work.
2. To enhance the durability of the book, the publisher chose to inbind the cover with a thick, protective layer.
3. She carefully inbind the loose sheets of paper, turning her scattered notes into a cohesive presentation.
4. The librarian suggested they inbind the old manuscripts to protect them from further damage.
5. After reviewing the project, the team agreed that they needed to inbind the documents for easier access and storage.
