

INCULPATION

Meaning: Inculcation refers to the act of accusing or implicating someone in a crime or wrongdoing.

1. The evidence presented during the trial led to the inculcation of the defendant in the robbery case.
2. Inculcation can often result from a misunderstanding of the facts surrounding an incident.
3. The lawyer argued that the inculcation of her client was based on circumstantial evidence rather than concrete proof.
4. Public pressure can sometimes influence the inculcation process, overshadowing the principle of innocent until proven guilty.
5. The report highlighted serious flaws in the investigation that contributed to the wrongful inculcation of an innocent person.
