

INDICT

Meaning: To formally accuse or charge someone with a serious crime, typically through a legal process involving a grand jury.

1. The grand jury decided to indict the suspect on multiple charges related to fraud.

3. The decision to indict the former official sent shockwaves through the political landscape.
