Meaning: Insubstantial refers to something that lacks sufficient evidence, significance, or solidity; it is weak or unconvincing.

3. Despite his insubstantial contributions to the project, he took full credit for its success.
4. The committee dismissed the proposal due to its insubstantial financial backing.
