

# INTERPEL

*Meaning: To interpel means to formally question or interrogate someone, often in a legal or official context, to seek clarification or information.*

1. The attorney sought to interpel the witness to clarify the inconsistencies in their testimony.
2. During the meeting, the committee members decided to interpel the director about the recent budget cuts.
3. As the debate intensified, the senator took the opportunity to interpel his opponent on key policy issues.
4. Critics of the government plan have begun to interpel officials for more transparency in their decision-making process.
5. In a surprising turn, the journalist chose to interpel the mayor during a live press conference, challenging his statements.
