

INTERPELLANT

Meaning: INTERPELLANT: A person, typically a member of a legislative body, who formally questions or challenges a government official or minister during a debate or parliamentary session.

1. The interpellant questioned the minister about the recent budget cuts during the parliamentary session.
2. In the debate, the interpellant's challenge forced the opposition to clarify their stance on healthcare policies.
3. As an interpellant, she felt it was her duty to hold the government accountable for its decisions.
4. The interpellant's probing inquiries revealed significant gaps in the administration's proposed reforms.
5. During the hearing, the interpellant emphasized the importance of transparency in public spending.
