Meaning: Kowtow: to act in an excessively subservient or deferential manner, often by yielding to the demands or opinions of others.

1. He refused to kowtow to the demands of his superiors, valuing his integrity over compliance.
2. During the meeting, she felt compelled to kowtow to the opinions of the more experienced team members.
3. The politician's attempt to kowtow to popular opinion backfired and alienated his core supporters.
