

LITERAL

Meaning: Literal: relating to the most basic, straightforward, or primary meaning of a word or phrase without metaphor or exaggeration.

1. The comedian's jokes often rely on literal interpretations of common phrases.
2. In her essay, she argued that the literal meaning of the text was often overshadowed by metaphorical interpretations.
3. He took her words too literally, misunderstanding the playful tone of her sarcasm.
4. The literal translation of the poem loses much of its original beauty and rhythm.
5. When he said he was on fire, he didn't mean it in a literal sense, just that he was performing exceptionally well.
6. The author's use of metaphor was so vivid that it often overshadowed the literal meaning of the text.
