

MACULE

Meaning: Macule: a small, discolored spot or blemish, especially on the skin or a plant surface.

1. The macule on her skin was a clear sign she needed to see a dermatologist.
2. In botany, a macule can refer to a small spot on a leaf or petal that differs in color from the surrounding area.
3. The artist skillfully incorporated a macule of bright red into the otherwise muted palette of the painting.
