Meaning: Median: the value separating the higher half from the lower half of a data set, often used to indicate the middle value in a distribution.

1. The median income in the region has increased significantly over the past decade.
2. To find the median of a set of numbers, you must first arrange them in order.
3. The median age of the participants provided insight into the demographic trends of the study.
4. In statistics, the median is often more representative of a typical value than the mean in skewed distributions.

7. In a data set, the median represents the middle value when the numbers are arranged in order.
