

METONYMY

Meaning: Metonymy is a figure of speech in which one word or phrase is substituted for another with which it is closely associated.

1. Metonymy is often used in literature to convey deeper meanings through associations.
2. In everyday speech, we might say "the White House issued a statement," using metonymy to refer to the President.
3. Shakespeare frequently employed metonymy to enrich his characters' dialogues and evoke strong imagery.
4. The phrase "Hollywood is known for its glamour" exemplifies metonymy by representing the film industry as a whole.
5. Writers use metonymy to create a vivid connection between an idea and a related object, enhancing their narratives.

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
