

# MISAFFIRM

*Meaning: MISAFFIRM (verb): To incorrectly or intentionally affirm a statement or position, often to undermine or contradict it.*

1. The lawyer advised his client to misaffirm the previous statements to avoid contradictions.
2. In the debate, she chose to misaffirm the opposing argument, highlighting its flaws.
3. To protect her reputation, she had no choice but to misaffirm the rumors circulating about her.
4. The politician attempted to misaffirm his earlier promises during the press conference.
5. In his speech, he decided to misaffirm the misinformation that had been spread about the policy.
