

MISGROUND

Meaning: Misground: (verb) to improperly establish or prepare the foundational base of a structure or artistic work, resulting in instability or imbalance.

1. The architect realized that the foundation of the building had been misground, leading to severe structural issues.
2. Despite his best efforts, the artist felt that her latest sculpture was misground, lacking the intended balance and harmony.
3. The environmental report indicated that the soil in the area was misground, affecting local plant growth and wildlife.

5. The team was frustrated to discover that their calculations were based on misground data, which undermined the entire project.
