Meaning: Misreform: to implement changes or reforms that inadvertently worsen a system or lead to negative outcomes instead of improvement.

1. The politician's plan was criticized for its potential to misreform the educational system rather than improve it.
2. In an effort to push through his agenda, he inadvertently misreformed key policies that once benefited the community.
3. The expert warned that a lack of clear guidelines could lead to misreform in the healthcare sector.
4. Many feared that the new legislation would misreform the economy, creating more problems than it solved.
5. Activists argued that the proposed changes would misreform social welfare, ultimately harming those it aimed to help.
