Meaning: Misset (verb): to incorrectly set or schedule something, such as a date or timer.

2. Due to a misset timer, the cake ended up overbaking in the oven.
3. She realized she had misset her alarm and overslept for an important appointment.
4. The photographer misset the focus, resulting in blurry images from the event.
5. In the rush to leave, he misset his GPS, leading them on a longer route than necessary.
