Meaning: MISTRAIN (verb): To misinterpret or misguide someone's understanding or enthusiasm, often leading to confusion or incorrect beliefs.

1. The teacher was careful not to mistain the students' enthusiasm for learning.
2. After several months of training, he realized that he had mistained his understanding of the complex theories.
3. It's easy to mistain someone's intentions if you don't communicate clearly.
4. She felt she might mistain her reputation if she spoke out against the popular opinion.
5. The artist aimed to capture the essence of the landscape without allowing his brush to mistain the details.
