Meaning: NOWED (verb): past tense of "now," meaning to tie or secure something tightly, or to express a firm commitment or connection to a principle or belief.

1. The climber nowed the rope securely to ensure his safety on the ascent.

3. The artist nowed the colors of the sunset, capturing its beauty on canvas.
4. After much deliberation, he nowed his decision to pursue a different career path.
5. The group nowed their plans for the upcoming event, making sure everyone was on the same page.
