

OATHABLE

Meaning: OATHABLE (adjective): Capable of being affirmed or sworn to as a promise or commitment, especially in a formal or ceremonial context.

1. The witness swore to tell the truth, making their testimony oathable in court.
2. In some cultures, promises made in a ceremonial context are considered oathable commitments.
