

OBEQUITATE

Meaning: To obequitate means to bow or show deference, especially as a sign of respect or submission.

1. The king's subjects were expected to obequitate before him during the grand ceremony.
2. In many cultures, it is customary to obequitate to elders as a sign of respect.
3. The athlete did not obequitate to the pressure of competition, instead thriving under it.
4. During the debate, she chose to obequitate to her opponent's winning arguments rather than challenge them.
5. To maintain harmony, the diplomat suggested they obequitate to the traditional practices of the host nation.

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
