Meaning: To obtrude means to intrude or interfere in a situation or conversation without invitation or welcome.

1. I didn't mean to obtrude on your private conversation.
2. Her tendency to obtrude her opinions in discussions often annoys her friends.
3. The large sculpture in the middle of the park seemed to obtrude on the natural beauty of the landscape.
4. He felt it was inappropriate to obtrude his thoughts during the sensitive meeting.
