

OBVERT

Meaning: To obvert means to turn or direct something in a different way or to change its focus, often to present an alternative perspective or approach.

1. To obvert the situation, she suggested a different approach that might yield better results.
2. The artist chose to obvert the traditional themes, exploring contemporary issues instead.
3. In order to obvert the negative feedback, he focused on the positive aspects of the project.
4. The scientist aimed to obvert the prevailing theories by presenting new evidence.
5. During the discussion, he decided to obvert the topic to avoid further conflict.
