

OUTBRIBE

Meaning: To outbribe means to offer greater bribes than competitors in order to gain an advantage or secure a favorable outcome.

1. In a competitive bidding war, the company sought to outbribe its rivals to secure the lucrative contract.
2. The politician was accused of trying to outbribe his opponent by offering voters extravagant gifts.
3. During the negotiations, both sides attempted to outbribe each other, leading to a scandal that shook the community.
