

# OUTBUD

*Meaning: Outbud (verb): To produce new buds or shoots more abundantly than another plant or in greater quantity, typically during a growth period.*

1. The young tree began to outbud the older ones in the garden.
2. As spring approached, the flowers started to outbud, filling the landscape with vibrant colors.
3. The plant's ability to outbud in unfavorable conditions surprised the botanists studying it.
4. With each passing week, the seedlings began to outbud, promising a bountiful harvest.
5. In an effort to encourage growth, the gardener ensured the soil was rich enough for the roses to outbud.
