Meaning: Outshut: (verb) to close or block off an opening, such as a window or curtain, preventing light or air from entering.

1. The sudden storm caused the windows to outshut, preventing any light from entering the room.
2. As the sun began to set, the curtains were outshut to keep the warmth inside.
3. He noticed that the door had been outshut, sealing off the cold draft from the hallway.
4. She preferred to outshut the world when she needed time to think and reflect.
5. With a flick of the wrist, he managed to outshut the blinds, plunging the room into darkness.
