Meaning: Outsleep (verb): To sleep longer than someone else or to sleep excessively, often to the detriment of waking up on time.

1. I always try to outsleep my friends on weekends by napping longer than they do.
2. She set an alarm to ensure she wouldn't outsleep her important meeting the next morning.
3. Every time we go camping, my brother seems to outsleep everyone in the tent.
4. He was determined to outsleep his previous record of ten hours in a single night.
5. Despite the loud party next door, she managed to outsleep all the noise and wake up refreshed.
