

OUTSPAN

Meaning: Outspan (verb): to unhitch or remove animals from a vehicle or harness, allowing them to rest or graze.

1. The wagon train decided to outspan for the night at the edge of the river.
2. Farmers often outspan their animals to give them a chance to graze in the open fields.
3. During the long journey, the travelers agreed to outspan whenever they found a suitable resting place.
4. In the early days of the settlement, it was common to outspan near water sources.
5. As the sun set, they chose to outspan under the shade of a large oak tree.
