

# OUTSWELL

*Meaning: OUTSWELL (verb): To overflow or exceed the limits of a container or boundary, especially in reference to water bodies during periods of increased volume.*

1. The river began to outswell its banks after the heavy rainfall.
2. During the spring thaw, the lake tends to outswell, flooding nearby fields.
3. He was worried that the crowd would outswell the venue's capacity if they didn't manage entry quickly.
4. The debate over the new policy could outswell the initial expectations of the committee.
5. As the festival approached, excitement in the community seemed to outswell last year's turnout.
