Meaning: Outvoice (verb): To speak or sing louder or more effectively than someone else in order to be heard or to dominate a conversation or performance.

3. The crowd cheered so loudly that it seemed they could outvoice the band playing on stage.
4. To win the argument, she needed to outvoice the critics and present her perspective confidently.
5. During the meeting, he found it challenging to outvoice the dominant personalities around the table.
