Meaning: OUTVOTE (verb): To defeat an opposing vote by receiving a greater number of votes in favor of a different proposal or decision.

1. The committee decided to hold a vote to see if they could outvote the opposition's proposal.
2. In the heated debate, the majority managed to outvote the dissenters, ensuring the policy would pass.
3. Voters can often outvote the interests of powerful lobbyists if they turn out in large numbers.
