

OVERPOLISH

Meaning: Overpolish (verb): to excessively refine or perfect something, often to the detriment of its original character or appeal.

1. Overpolish your work, and you risk losing its authenticity and charm.
2. The artist decided to leave some rough edges in her sculpture rather than overpolish it.
3. His tendency to overpolish his presentations made them feel artificial and less engaging.
4. In an effort to impress, she overpolished her resume, but it backfired during the interview.
5. The editor warned the writer not to overpolish the manuscript, as it might strip away its original voice.
